Our grandchildren are growing up in a strange new world – at least it's strange to us! And it is critical that we get more engaged because we live in dangerous times. As John Stonestreet, President of The Colson Center, asserts, "Ideas have consequences and bad ideas have victims!"

- "Expressive Individualism" which believes the "self" is pure, expressing our psychological self is what makes us who we are, and traditional morality is a threat that must be legally confronted.

- "De-Construction of Man, Woman, & Family" which challenges the definition of marriage, the roles of men and women, and the authority of parental figures.

Our goal for the morning is to both define the challenges we face and discuss how we can help equip our grandchildren (of every age) with a biblical worldview. It is the worldview that God provides for us in Genesis 1-3, envisioning our origin, identity, role, family, and purpose. A motivated group of 30+ new and seasoned grandparents participated in the Grandparenting Matters Class in February at FBC. Here are a few insights they gained in their own words.



- "I realized I need to work on a plan if I'm going to be spiritually influential in my grandchildren's lives."

- "Strengthening, and in one case restoring, my relationship with my adult children is critical to my access and influence in my grandkid's lives."
