

Allow God to speak to you through his written Word. The goal of this time is to have quality connection and time together. Choose questions from Know, Grow, and Show that will best help your group discuss the passage and take their next steps of faith. Don't feel like you need to use all the questions. Feel free to add your own too! We are praying for you as you lead your D-Group this week!

KNOW (Build Relationships)

- 1. What's one thing you are really good at or skilled at that might surprise the rest of the group?
- 2. What was your first job? What did you learn from it?
- 3. Who is someone you really admire for their faith and why?
- 4. How has your faith evolved over the years, and what lessons have you learned about trusting God's promises?
- 5. What is one habit or discipline you'd like to develop to strengthen your faith?
- 6. How do you prioritize your spiritual growth in the midst of daily responsibilities and challenges?
- 7. Is there anything you're struggling with in your faith right now?



- 1. How does Hebrews 11:1, which defines faith as the assurance of things hoped for and the conviction of things not seen, help us understand the nature of faith and its ability to guide us through unseen aspects of life? How does Hebrews 11:1-3 connect to the concept of living in light of eternity? (see Hebrews 13:14)
- 2. According to verses 3-7, how did people like Abel, Enoch and Noah demonstrate their faith? What can we learn from their examples?
- 3. According to Hebrews 11:6, how does God reward those who seek Him?
- 4. Read verses 8-12 about Abraham. What challenges did he face in obeying God's call? How do you see faith at work in his life?
- 5. Read Hebrews 11:8-16. What did Abraham give up by faith, and what promises did God give him?
- 6. Verses 13-16 say the patriarchs were "strangers and exiles on the earth" desiring a better heavenly country. How can having an eternal perspective help our faith?
- 7. In verses 17-19, how did Abraham's faith allow him to obey God's command to sacrifice Isaac? What does this teach about trusting God's promises?
- 8. "Faith is not believing that God can, but that He will." F.F. Bosworth. How does this quote relate to Hebrews 11?
- 9. Read Hebrews 11:17-22. How does Isaac and Jacob demonstrate faith in this passage?
- 10. How did Moses demonstrate faith by prioritizing eternal values over temporary pleasures, as discussed in Hebrews 11:24-28?
- 11. According to verses 32-34, the faith of people like Gideon, Barak and Samson empowered them to accomplish great things. How does faith make us strong?
- 12. Verses 35-38 describe the suffering many faced because of their faith. Why is enduring persecution a mark of genuine faith?

e-e SHOW: (Live on Mission)

- 1. What is one area where you need to trust God more and take a step of faith? How can this group support you?
- 2. What comforts, relationships, or pursuits might God be calling you to sacrifice or give up to follow Him more wholeheartedly?
- 3. Who is one person you can share the reasons for the hope you have in Christ with this week? (1 Peter 3:15)
