KNOW

- Finish this sentence: "I'm not like most people when it comes to _____." Why?
- If you could know exactly what one person in your life really thinks of you — would you want to know? Why or why not?
- Has anyone ever forgiven you for something so completely that it genuinely surprised you — either from another person or from God? What did that feel like, and what did it reveal about the person who forgave you?
- Think of a time you held a grudge. What made it so hard to let go?
- How has your picture of who God is changed over the years — especially His willingness to forgive?
- Have you ever been surprised by grace — when someone forgave you far more quickly or completely than you expected?
- When in your walk with God has His way of doing things turned out to be completely different from what you expected — and better?
- What is one thing you are carrying into the room tonight that you'd like the group to keep in mind as you talk together?



GROW

- **ISAIAH 55:1–5** - God opens by inviting everyone to come to Him — without money, without price. What does this free invitation reveal about what God thinks of people and what He wants from them? How does it set the stage for vv. 6–11? *John 7:37; Rev 22:17; Matt 11:28–30*
- **ISAIAH 55:6–7** - God commands Israel to “seek the LORD” and to “return” to Him (v. 6–7). What does the word “return” tell us about Israel’s spiritual condition? And what does God’s invitation to return say about who initiated the relationship in the first place? *Luke 15:11–24;*
- Verse 7 promises that God will “abundantly pardon” — the Hebrew literally means He will multiply His forgiveness. What does it mean to you personally that God doesn’t forgive reluctantly or partially, but multiplies it? What did it cost Him to be able to offer this free forgiveness? *Is 53:4–6; Ps 103:10–12; Micah 7:18–19; Rom 5:8*

- **ISAIAH 55:8–9** - We often quote “my thoughts are not your thoughts” to explain why God allows hard things we don’t understand. But looking at the actual context — these verses explain God’s willingness to abundantly pardon (v. 7). How does that context change the way you read these verses?
- **ISAIAH 55:10–11** - God compares His Word to rain and snow that water the earth — it goes out from Him and accomplishes His purpose before returning. How does this promise encourage you when the gospel seems to have no visible effect on someone you love? *1 Cor 3:6–7; Heb 4:12; Is 46:10.*
- **ISAIAH 55:12–13** — The chapter closes with a vision of mountains singing and trees clapping. What does this image say about the scope of what God’s grace ultimately does — not just to individuals, but to all of creation? *Rom 8:19–21; Rev 21:1–5*
- Looking at Isaiah 55 as a whole: God freely invites (vv. 1–5), calls for return (vv. 6–7), reveals His higher ways in grace (vv. 8–9), promises His Word will not fail (vv. 10–11), and ends in cosmic joy (vv. 12–13). Where in that journey do you most often get stuck? What makes it hard to move all the way through to the joy?



SHOW

- Isaiah 55:6 says “Seek the LORD while he may be found.” Is there something holding you back from seeking God right now — a past failure, a lingering doubt, a fear that He won’t actually forgive? What would one step toward Him look like this week?
- God’s Word goes out and always accomplishes His purpose (v. 11). Think of one person in your life who needs to hear about Jesus. What is one specific way you could share, speak, or model God’s grace to them this week — and trust the results to Him?
