Registration

Do I need to register for Fellowship Kids?

At this time, all kids must register to attend a Fellowship Kids service. Registration for Sunday services will be available from 12:00 pm the preceding Sunday until Thursday at 12:00 pm.

The registration form offers different class options for ages and grades. How do I know which one to choose for my child?

Fellowship Kids will reopen with kids in the age or grade level classrooms that kids previously attended. For example, if your child has turned 4 years of age within the last school year, they would register for the 3-year-old class option. All kids will promote to the next age or grade level class on August 23rd.

What is available for a kid who did not register for a Fellowship Kids service?

If registration has closed or a classroom was full, we still encourage your family to attend worship services on campus. We believe the experience of being with others in worship and resuming some normalcy for kids is very important. If you're attending with a child who is not registered for Fellowship Kids, stop by the Fellowship Kids registration to pick up a welcome bag. The bag includes a sermon notes sheet, coloring page, crayons, and snack to help them engage in the worship service.

Will Fellowship Kids offer an online service for kids?

If you are worshipping from home, we encourage you to check out the Fellowship Kids Online Service! Our online experience will offer the same Bible story, worship videos, and family activities that kids are receiving in-person. Check-In & Getting to the Classroom

Since I registered, do I need to check-in at a kiosk or welcome desk?

All kids' tags and security pickup tags will be preprinted for registered families. Parents will be directed to pick up these tags from the volunteer-attended tables located at the side entrance, facing Mississippi St. All families and volunteers involved in Fellowship Kids will enter through these side doors.

Will Fellowship Kids check the temperature of kids or ask health screening questions?

Fellowship Kids asks that parents perform a temperature check at home before coming to church. Every child must register a temperature under 100.4 to attend Fellowship Kids. When picking up tags, the registration volunteer will ask standard screening questions for each child and confirm the temperature check was performed. If you forget to perform the temperature check, Fellowship Kids will use a no-touch infrared thermometer to check the child's temperature before entering Fellowship Kids.

What is Fellowship Kids' policy regarding masks?

We will strongly encourage all parents and kids to wear masks while commuting through the hallways of Fellowship Kids. Children 10 and under may remove their masks once they arrive in the classroom as long as they can maintain social distance.

Can I drop-off and pick-up my kid from Fellowship Kids as I normally would?

Parents will drop-off and pick-up their kids from the assigned classroom inside Fellowship Kids. However, we ask that only 1 adult enter the hallway for drop-off and pick-up so that we can limit the number of individuals in the hallways of Fellowship Kids.

Size and Schedule

Which classrooms will be open in Fellowship Kids?

On August 2nd, Fellowship Kids will open classrooms for toddlers, preschool, and elementary kids. Toddler 1 (younger toddlers) will meet upstairs in their normal room. Toddler 2, PreK/Kinder, and 1-3 Grade will meet downstairs in our newly opened rooms. At this time, the nursery classroom will not be open. 456 (4th, 5th, & 6th grade) will reopen on August 23rd.

How many kids are expected in each classroom?

All classrooms will be open at a limited capacity. Toddler and Preschool classrooms will be limited to 30% capacity or 5 kids per classroom. Our elementary group will be limited to 50% capacity or 12 kids in our large room.

How will Fellowship Kids practice social distancing?

Toddler and preschool classrooms will utilize colored carpet squares to encourage kids to socially distance while playing and listening to the Bible story. These classrooms will also spread chairs at each table to maintain distance between kids.

Our elementary large group will utilize four 5-foot round tables. Each table will seat 3 kids at a social distance of 3 to 6 feet between seats. Classroom supplies will be divided for use at each table.

Will kids rotate between other classrooms or large group worship during the service?

Kids will remain in the assigned classroom for the entire service. All elements of a typical Fellowship Kids experience (Bible story, worship, and small group activities) will be done within the classroom. Will Fellowship Kids serve snacks during the service?

Toddler and preschool classrooms will serve only snacks that are individual serving and do not require kids to touch the snacks while putting them into their mouths (ex. squeeze apple sauce pouch).

Safety & Volunteers

Will volunteers be required to wear face masks? Will there be other precautions or screening for volunteers?

Volunteers will be required to wear masks for the hour which they are serving.

For toddler classrooms with diapering procedures, volunteers are required to wear gloves and masks while changing a child's diaper. There will also be added steps—beyond our normal procedures—to sanitize the changing station before and after each child.

In addition to the typical volunteer requirements of Fellowship Kids, all volunteers will be asked standard health screening questions and temperature checked when they arrive to serve.

How will classrooms and common areas be sanitized before service?

The Fellowship Kids staff and Facilities Director will work as a team to ensure that every environment is properly cleaned and prepared before Sunday. Facilities team members will be onsite to clean bathrooms, hallways, and all common spaces before service. All cleaning products are food-safe products that have been recommended and approved for sanitizing areas for children.
