## JANUARY 2026

**LET YOUR KINGDOM COME, AND YOUR WILL BE DONE IN MY WORK AS IT IS IN HEAVEN.**

*What would it look like to genuinely pray for God's kingdom to come and His will to be done in your work? We want to encourage you to receive, reflect, and pray over Scripture each week throughout the month of January. Take moments during the week to marinate in the Word and commune with God. He loves to hear His people pray. Not just for ourselves, but for others as well. May His kingdom come, and His will be done in our work!*

*\*We are defining "work" as your vocation, realizing that many work inside the home or perhaps in volunteer settings. We believe these prayer focuses are applicable in all of these places.*

### WEEK 1

***Spend this week receiving, reflecting, and praying over Genesis 2:15.*** Before sin, while all was right with God, work existed. God created the garden of Eden to be worked in. Work began as a gift and provision from God, a way to glorify and honor Him. When we work, we reflect His image. God worked for six days and rested on the seventh. Take time to thank God for the work He has given you, to help you see your work through Scripture, and to give you a heart of gratitude, endurance, and excellence. Pray for those you know who need work, that God may provide for their needs.

## WEEK 2

*Spend this week receiving, reflecting, and praying over*

**Proverbs 16:3; Psalm 90:17; Jeremiah 29:7.** In our broken world, work can often be difficult, wearisome, and exhausting. Ask God to help you be the kind of worker that perseveres under pressure and benefits the company by who you are and how you work. Commit your work to the Lord and seek the welfare of the people you work with and those you impact. Pray that God would bless the work of your hands.

## WEEK 3

*Spend this week receiving, reflecting and praying over*

**Ecclesiastes 9:10 (NLT); 1 Corinthians 10:31;**

**Colossians 3:22–24.** Ask God to give you the heart, mind, and will to work with purpose and excellence in all you do. The Lord is your ultimate boss, so work in such a way that you are serving and pleasing Christ above all. No matter your position, pray that God would help you lead, work, and engage in ways that exhibit the fruit of God's Spirit.

## WEEK 4

*Spend this week receiving, reflecting and praying over Luke*

**5:27–32.** Who in your workplace needs to know the grace and love of God? The simple answer is... everyone! No matter who you work with, we all stand in need of God's grace. Pray for individuals by name and look for opportunities to introduce them to and encourage them in Jesus. Pray that God's Word would strengthen and equip you.
