Over this next month, we want to focus on four kingdom prayers. We want to encourage you to receive, reflect, and pray over Scripture each week throughout the month of June. Take moments during the week to marinate in the Word and commune with God. He loves to hear His people pray. Not just for ourselves, but for others as well. WEEK 1 | KINGDOM PRAISE

Spend this week receiving, reflecting, and praying over Matthew 6:9; Psalm 86:8–9; Psalm 105:3. In the prayer of Jesus, believers are commanded to hallow God's name. Treasure His name. Cherish His name. Stand in awe of His name. Other Scripture commands us to glory in His name, for there is no greater name! Resist the temptation to glory in your own name and give God the praise He absolutely deserves today.



WEEK 2 | KINGDOM PROVISION

Spend this week receiving, reflecting, and praying over Matthew 6:11; Psalm 145:14–17; Philippians 4:19.

Our God is not lacking in resources. He is fully able to supply every need. Humbly ask God for your daily bread and give thanks to Him for the provision He provides. Pray also for His provision in the lives of others. Pray specifically for those impacted through our Summer Feeding Initiative, that God will give them grace and provision in their time of need.

WEEK 3 | KINGDOM KINDNESS

Spend this week receiving, reflecting, and praying over Matthew 6:12; Colossians 3:12–14; Ephesians 4:32.

Forgiveness is such a powerful gift, initiated and fueled by the kindness and grace of God in Christ. Pray for the grace to both receive and give forgiveness. Consider how Jesus has forgiven you and let that glorious truth lead you to forgive others. Who is God asking you to forgive, that His Kingdom may come and His will be done?

WEEK 4 | KINGDOM HOLINESS

Spend this week receiving, reflecting, and praying over Matthew 6:13; 1 Peter 1:13–16; 1 Peter 5:8–9. We live in a broken, sinful world full of temptation and evil. We need God's rescuing grace for the evil that lurks within our own hearts and His mighty armor to stand against the schemes of the devil. Christ has both called us and equipped us to be holy. May His Kingdom come and will be done in our pursuit of holiness.
