PRAYER GUIDE NOVEMBER 2025

LET YOUR KINGDOM COME, AND YOUR WILL BE DONE, IN MY FRIENDSHIPS.

What would it look like to genuinely pray for God's kingdom to come and His will to be done in your friendships? We want to encourage you to receive, reflect, and pray over Scripture each week throughout the month of November. Take moments during the week to marinate in the Word and commune with God. He loves to hear His people pray. May His kingdom come, and His will be done in our friendships!

Spend this week receiving, reflecting, and praying over Proverbs 18:24;

John 15:13-15. Consider with gratitude and amazement this week that you are a friend of God. Through faith in Jesus Christ, you have been reconciled, literally put into friendship with God. He never changes and He is always with you. He is for you, not against you, and nothing can separate you from His love. What a friend we have in Jesus!



WEEK 2 | Spend this week receiving, reflecting, and praying over

Proverbs 27:17; Proverbs 17:17; 1 Samuel 23:16

(NLT). Give thanks and praise to God this week for the friends in your life who point you to Jesus and help strengthen your faith. Pray for God's kingdom to come and His will to be done in their lives.

Spend this week receiving, reflecting, and praying over Mark

5:18-20; Mark 2:13-17. What friends has God placed in your life that do not yet believe in Jesus? Pray for the courage to share how Jesus has changed your life through His love and grace and how He can do the same for them. If you have no unbelieving friends, ask God to open doors for new friendships with the purpose of sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ.

WEEK 4 | Spend this week receiving, reflecting, and praying over

Romans 12:18; Ephesians 4:31-32. Are there friendships in your life in need of reconciliation? Broken relationships that need to be restored? Ask God to soften your heart, grant you the strength to forgive the wrongs done to you, and the courage to seek peace as much as it depends on you. When God's kingdom comes, He provides the grace to forgive and to reconcile.
